Schinus terebinthifolia

Description

- Can grow from a low shrub to a tree of several metres
- Trees are normally found in dense numbers along stream beds
- It has dark-green, leathery leaves
- The small white flowers produce abundant red berries, which may be dispersed by mynas or washed down streams
- It is also capable of spreading via suckers

Distribution

- Found in dryland areas, around 300-500m, and along water-courses
- Found in many valleys, including Sharks Valley, Sandy Bay Valley and near Heart Shape Waterfall

Habitat

Habitat includes:

- Sparsely vegetated hillside
- Dry gully
- Alien thickets/hedges

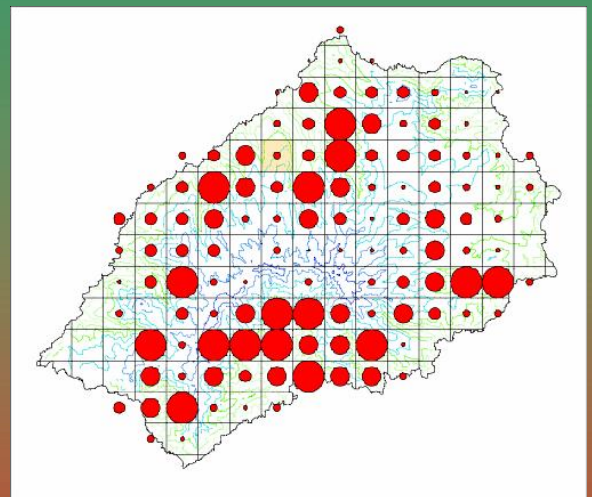
